The Five W's of ELD - Why?





US CONGRESS MANDATED FMCSA TO PUBLISH A RULE

- Improve Safety
- Improve Compliance with HOS Rules
- ELD includes requirements for
 - Device specifications
 - Prohibiting harassment
 - Supporting documentation

ELD FINAL RULE STATS

Avoid 1844 crashes

Prevent 562 injuries

Save 26 lives

The Five W's of ELD - Who?

HOS Regulations

- Interstate operators
- 10,000 lb. or more
- or Hazmat carriers
- Property AND Passenger



The Five W's of ELD - Who?



ELD Exemptions

- Less than 10,000 lbs
- Intrastate commerce exemption
- Short-haul / less than 8 days in rolling 30 day period
- Driveaway tow-away operators
- Vehicles older than 2000





The Five W's of ELD - What?



ELD = Electronic Logging Device

What is the ELD Final Rule Mandate?

- Final Rule expectations and technical specifications as defined on FMCSA website https://www.fmcsa.dot.gov/hours-service/elds/electronic-logging-devices
- 4 year implementation plan to upgrade from paper or other elog system to Final Rule specs
- 395.15 AOBRD solution currently supported but will be phased out
- All systems must be ELD final rule compliant by December 16, 2019
- Vendor qualifications and certification

The Five W's of ELD - What?





Mandate will apply to all drivers who currently are required to keep paper RODS (Record of Duty status)

Those who keep them for at least 8 or more of 30 days must use an ELD



Device is installed in vehicle

Driver device collects & communicates with vehicle


Devices send data to admin

AOBRD or ELD may be installed until compliance date

Can keep using AOBRD installed before Dec 17, 2017


All must be on electronic logs

- Upgrading from AOBRD to ELD
- Adding more units

The Five W's of ELD - Where?



- United States operations
- Drivers within the US
 - --This includes Canada & Mexico domiciled drivers while in the US
- Unless qualified for an exemption



Driver - and DOT - Familiarity


- Majority of drivers have used a smart device






