Graham passed a dynamic association to me, one that is embarking on a major initiative, our Certified Canadian Mover Program.

This program was designed to provide the consumer with assurance that the mover they choose is reputable and will provide professional service. And equally, that a mover who is not certified may not have the same commitment to service that CAM's members do.

The operation of the program has provided certified movers with many referrals, and given consumers advice about good movers and warnings about bad ones. This activity has significantly increased the value of CAM membership for Canadian movers.

Through this process, CAM is establishing working relationships with consumer affairs departments in provincial governments and Industry Canada. Government agencies are now referring consumers to CAM for sourcing a mover and registering a complaint.

As I write this, CAM is organizing its annual conference. CAM always works to provide members with useful information at its conferences: about new methods for doing business, operational efficiencies, the economic environment and competitive tools. This year's conference will continue this tradition, by providing information movers can use to improve their bottom-line results: information about revenue improvement and cost savings in the most important areas — customer service, labour costs, vehicle selection, acquisition and operation, and supplies. And, of course, supplier members will be showcasing their products.

I am looking forward to working with all members of the Canadian Association of Movers to improve the image of movers to consumers, and improve the competitive position of CAM members in the marketplace.

En parallèle, l'ACD établit des relations d'affaires avec les offices de protection des consommateurs et avec Industrie Canada. Des agences gouvernementales dirigent dorénavant des clients vers l'ACD pour trouver un déménageur ou déposer une plainte.

L'ACD prépare sa conférence annuelle, qui lui permet toujours de dispenser de l'information utile à ses membres, sur les nouvelles façons de faire, l'efficacité, l'état du marché ou les outils pour se démarquer. La tradition se poursuit cette année. Nous aborderons des thèmes relatifs à la rentabilité : augmentation des revenus et diminution des dépenses dans les domaines cruciaux, c'est-à-dire le service à la clientèle, la masse salariale, le parc de véhicules et les fournitures. This is the 14th issue of *The Canadian Mover*. It was first published in 1997 as an annual directory and progressed to semi-annual status a few years later.

This issue has two articles that we sourced from other moving associations: one from the British Association of Removers on its new Code of Practice and the other from the American Moving and Storage Association on cross-border operations into and out of the United States. These two topics have significant applications to Canadian movers in their operations.

The past year has been a very busy one for the Canadian Association of Movers' administration. Implementation and support of CAM's Certified Canadian Mover Program have taken a significant amount of time, all of it resulting in a valuable referral and enquiry service for CAM members.

Members are finding that the program is a useful sales tool. They are using it as part of their sales-closing process to distinguish themselves from non-certified movers.

We have referred hundreds of moves to members, validated members' certifications to consumers and fielded a large number of complaints. Requests for referrals and complaint handling have come directly from consumers, from Better Business Bureaus across Canada and from provincial consumer-affairs departments.

Through the complaint-handling process, we have become familiar with who the bad guys in the industry are. As much as we are able, we now direct consumers away from those players.

Increasing membership remains a major priority for CAM. Efforts are being made to reach out to movers across Canada and internationally. The #1 benefit to movers of CAM membership remains what it has always been — to further the interests of owner-managed moving and storage companies. CAM has certainly been working toward that objective with its recent initiatives in communications with consumers and consumer agencies.

Nous avons référé des centaines de commandes à des membres; confirmé des certifications à des clients et enregistré un grand nombre de plaintes. Les demandes de référence et les plaintes nous sont parvenues directement des clients, des bureaux d'éthique commerciale de partout au Canada et des offices de la protection des consommateurs.

Le traitement des plaintes nous a permis de mieux identifier les mauvais joueurs dans notre secteur et, dans la mesure du possible, d'en éloigner les consommateurs.

Le recrutement des membres demeure une priorité. Nous déployons des efforts pour joindre les déménageurs au Canada et à l'étranger. Le premier avantage d'être membre de l'ACD reste inchangé, puisque nous continuons à défendre les intérêts des entreprises de déménagement et d'entreposage gérées par leurs propriétaires. L'ACD a continué à travailler en ce sens, dans ses démarches de communication auprès des consommateurs et organismes de protection.

BAR Code of Practice



Robert Syers

A huge amount of work, time and effort has gone on behind the scenes to progress the British Association of Removers (BAR) Code of Practice. BAR General Secretary Robert Syers provides an update on what has been achieved.

This article is reprinted from the August 2004 issue of Removals & Storage with permission of the British Association of Removers. It is intended to show Canadian movers the efforts another moving association is making to set standards for its industry. The article contains many good concepts that could be incorporated into CAM's Certified Canadian Mover Program. CAM will publish updates as they become available.

Over the last year, Past President Robert Bartup and I have been engaged in what sometimes seems to be an endless round of meetings, correspondence, emails and phone calls with the Office of Fair Trading (OFT) and others in the attempt to move the matter of the BAR Code of Practice forward.

The BAR Code has been promoted, explained and pored over in minute detail, while at the same time OFT has had its own internal problems in launching its much-vaunted Consumer Codes Approval Scheme.

The Scheme is the only one of its kind in the world and more rigorous than anything previously proposed. The OFT is, therefore, to some extent feeling its way towards developing a Codes regime that is widely taken up, but that, at the same time, is sufficiently stringent to ensure credibility.

One problem has been to close the gap between what the OFT would like BAR as a trade association to do and

what BAR can actually achieve.

To recap: BAR has applied to have its Code of Practice recognized and approved under the OFT Consumer Codes Approval Scheme.

Before I go on to say how far we have got with this process, I think it would be helpful to remind ourselves of the rationale and main features of the proposed Code.

The main aims of the OFT Consumer Codes Approval Scheme are to

promote and safeguard consumers' interests by helping them identify better businesses, and to encourage those businesses to raise their standards of customer service.

The core criteria cover the organization of the Code sponsor (that's us: BAR), the preparation and content of the code, complaints handling, monitoring, compliance and publicity.

The Consumer Codes Approval Scheme consists of two co-dependent stages — The Promise and The Proof — and the BAR makes a promise that its Code meets the OFT's core criteria.

The Code regime is based on specific principles:

- Code sponsors should have significant influence on the sector;
- Independent disciplinary procedures should be in place to deal with non-compliance;
- Consumers, enforcement bodies and advisory services must be consulted throughout the preparation, operation and monitoring of the Code;
- Codes must address real issues and cover such matters as advertising, pre-contractual information, delivery completion dates, guarantees and after-sales service;
- Code members must have effective complaints procedures in place;
- Conciliation services must be available;
- Performance indicators, such as mystery shopping or Code audits, must be established;

Code de conduite de la **BAR**

La British Association of Removers (BAR) s'est beaucoup démenée en coulisse pour promouvoir son code de conduite. Son secrétaire général Robert Syers nous relate les progrès.

Cet article est tiré de l'édition d'août 2004 de Removals & Storage, avec la permission de la British Association of Removers (BAR). Nous désirons présenter aux déménageurs canadiens les efforts que déploie une autre association pour établir des normes dans son secteur. On y trouve plusieurs idées qui pourraient être intégrées au Programme de certification de l'Association canadienne des déménageurs (ACD). Celle-ci fera état des progrès dans le dossier.

Depuis un an, l'ex-président Robert Bartup et moi multiplions les rencontres, lettres et appels pour faire reconnaître le code de conduite de la BAR auprès de l'Office of Fair Trading (OFT) et d'autres organismes.

Nous avons dû expliquer notre code à l'OFT alors que ce dernier était aux prises avec des problèmes internes, liés au lancement de son cadre de reconnaissance des codes de protection du consommateur.

Le cadre de reconnaissance de l'OFT est non seulement unique au monde : c'est aussi le plus sévère. L'OFT est donc en voie de formuler un cadre largement à la fois acceptable aux yeux du plus grand nombre et assez contraignant pour en assurer la crédibilité.

Parmi les problèmes : combler l'écart entre les attentes de l'OFT à l'endroit de la BAR en tant que corporation et les véritables pouvoirs de notre organisme.

Bref, la BAR a soumis son code à l'OFT afin qu'il soit reconnu et approuvé aux termes du nouveau cadre.

Avant d'aborder ce processus, rappelons la justification et les grandes lignes du code proposé :

Le cadre de l'OFT vise d'abord à défendre les consommateurs en les aidant à reconnaître les meilleurs déménageurs et à encourager ces derniers à resserrer leurs standards.

Les principaux critères concernent le pouvoir de contrainte du promoteur du code (en l'occurrence la BAR), la formulation du code, le traitement des plaintes, la supervision, la surveillance et la publicité.

Le cadre de l'OFT prévoit deux étapes : l'attestation et la démonstra-

tion. Dans la première étape, la BAR doit attester que son code répond aux principaux critères.

Le cadre repose sur les principes suivants :

- Le promoteur d'un code doit exercer une influence significative dans son secteur.
- On doit mettre en place un processus disciplinaire indépendant.
- Des consommateurs, des organismes de surveillance et des services-conseil doivent être consultés tout au long de la formulation, de la mise en application et de la surveillance du code.
- Le code doit répondre à de vrais besoins et couvrir notamment la publicité, l'information donnée aux clients, les délais, les garanties et le service après-vente.

- Enforcement arrangements must be created;
- The Code must be given adequate publicity.

BAR must make sure its Code contains measures designed to remove or ease consumer concerns and undesirable trading practices in its sector. At this stage, BAR is not allowed to claim OFT approval for its Code, because there has not yet been an evaluation of how well the Code is working in practice.

BAR must prove its Code lives up to the initial promise it made. The burden of proof lies with BAR as Code sponsor. BAR must also show that the Code is being effectively implemented by all who claim to adhere to it and that consumer disputes are properly resolved. When this burden of proof has been met, OFT approval of the Code and promotion will follow.

An important principle in developing the Code is that consumers, enforcement bodies and advisory services must be consulted throughout the preparation, operation and monitoring of the Code. And it is this aspect that has occupied much of our time.

There were three categories of consultation:

- Membership consultation;
- OFT consultation;
- External consultation.

First, it was vital to obtain the support of the membership. The Code is all about self-regulation, and BAR needed to make sure it was accepted by the

membership at large.

A draft of the Code was tabled and discussed at National Council and Board level, and circulated, together with a response questionnaire, to all members, area secretaries and even affiliates. Comment and criticism was invited, and received, I am pleased to report, not only from the usual respondents, but also from many more-unexpected quarters. Every single comment was carefully considered and, where appropriate, incorporated into the working draft.

At the same time, OFT conducted its own internal consultation and referred the Code to its Competition Enforcement Division and its Markets & Policies Initiatives Division. This was, in particular, to ensure that the code did not contravene any legal requirements relating to the Competition Act. I am happy to say this did not present any significant problems.

External Consultation

Next, the Code went through a process of external consultation, in which OFT invited various consumer bodies and enforcement agencies to comment.

The Code was scrutinized by:

- The Consumers' Association;
- Local Authorities Coordinators of Regulatory Services (LACORS);
- The Trading Standards Institute.

Each of these bodies offered comment and criticism. More meetings and correspondence, including an

des politiques, afin de s'assurer qu'il ne contrevenait pas à la loi sur la concurrence. Heureusement, il n'y avait rien de sérieux à signaler.

Consultation externe

Le code a ensuite fait l'objet d'une consultation externe : l'OFT a invité

plusieurs groupes de consommateurs et organismes de surveillance à émettre leurs commentaires.

Le code a été examiné de près par trois organismes :

- Consumers' Association;
- Local Authorities Coordinators of Regulatory Services;
- Trading Standards Institute.

Chacun de ces organismes a émis des commentaires et des critiques. Des rencontres et des correspondances supplémentaires (dont une intéressante rencontre avec la Consumers' Association) nous ont permis d'expliquer les aspects plus ésotériques du domaine du déménagement. C'était là une étape indispensable. En effet, si nous voulons que notre code rassure les consommateurs, ces derniers doivent forcément le comprendre.

Nous avons de nouveau amendé le code à la lumière des consultations. Nous avons aussi rencontré l'unité des pratiques déloyales de l'OFT pour discuter des révisions aux modalités de contrats en préparation depuis quelque temps. Quelques inquiétudes ont été soulevées quant aux conditions des contrats, mais en constatant les complications amenées par le projet de règlement sur la signature des documents financiers, il a été convenu que nous n'en ferions pas un obstacle majeur.

Nous reparlerons de la consultation au moment d'aborder la phase de démonstration, le mois prochain.

Nous avons bon espoir que l'OFT reconnaîtrait que nous avons rempli toutes les conditions de la première

interesting face-to-face meeting with The Consumers' Association, took place to clarify and explain some of the more esoteric aspects of the removal industry to these outsiders. Of course, that is precisely what we as an industry need to do. This Code is, after all, about consumer confidence and must be understood by the end user — there must be transparency and clarity all the way through.

Again, the Code was modified to take into account many of the suggestions and comments received.

It should be mentioned here that we also had meetings with UCTU, The Unfair Contract Terms Unit of the OFT, to discuss revisions to the contract terms that had been in the pipeline for some time. There had been some concern about the contract conditions, but in the light of complications arising from the impending FSA regulations, it was eventually agreed that this would not be a major sticking point.

So much for consultation, at least in the preparation stage of the Code. I

shall return to this area when we look at what is involved in Stage Two — The Proof phase in the next issue.

So, where have we got to? We had harboured strong expectations that OFT would have accepted our completion of Stage One by now — and it would have done so had it not been for one particular issue.

We more or less reached agreement on all headings, except for that concerning the issue of pre-payment protection. We had always suspected that the pre-payment issue might be the hurdle to trip us up, and much time and effort has been expended on this problem.

At first, we were looking for ways to circumvent the issue and seek exemption from the requirement, but it eventually became apparent that the OFT were looking for BAR to produce a cast-iron, copper-bottomed, gold-plated guarantee that would protect customer pre-payments in any and all circumstances, including in the case of failure of the business.

The core criteria are:

- Protection mechanisms must be in place to ensure that consumers will have their advanced payments fully and speedily refunded in the event that businesses are unable to deliver goods/services;
- Consumers must not be subjected to excessive form-filling and/or other procedures before payments are refunded. The provisions of these mechanisms are to be brought to the attention of consumers.

After much debate and referral to its Legal Department, the OFT confirmed that this protection must extend to businesses unable to deliver services as a consequence of going into liquidation.

They suggested a number of options:

1. Insurance-backed guarantee scheme;
2. Bonds: similar to the Air Travel Organiser's Licence (ATOL);
3. Trusts: monies paid by customers are paid into a trust account held by a third party, such as a bank, solicitor or accountant. This might need to be backed by insurance to cover any shortfall;
4. Central Fund: Code sponsor generates a central fund using part of the membership fees;
5. Client Account: similar to a trust, but not administered by a third party.

There were practical reasons why BAR felt most of these options were not viable, and we put forward various arguments to support our view. Among these were:

1. Not all members charge in advance, and of those that do, many will have been paid by credit card; the customer is thereby protected in the event of services not being delivered;
2. The period of time between payment and work being carried out is usually less than two weeks — again the risk of exposure to loss is small;
3. In the event that a member does go out of business while holding customers' money, it is likely that the administrator would ensure work in progress is carried out, if not by the company's own staff and vehicles, then by a local industry partner (we pointed out that removers generally have strong mutually beneficial relationships with local competitors and

phase, mais un problème est survenu. . .

La protection des acomptes demeurait le seul objet de désaccord. Comme cette question était notre talon d'Achille, nous y avons consacré beaucoup de temps.

Nous voulions d'abord contourner le problème et nous exempter de cette obligation, mais il est vite devenu évident que l'OFT s'attendait à ce que la BAR fournisse des garanties blindées, même en cas de faillite.

Les principaux critères :

- Des mécanismes de protection doivent assurer un remboursement complet et rapide des acomptes dans le cas où une entreprise serait incapable de rendre les services promis.
- Les consommateurs ne sont pas censés se perdre dans un dédale administratif. Ils doivent connaître les recours.

Après en avoir débattu et référé à son Contentieux, l'OFT a réitéré que cette protection devait être étendue aux entreprises incapables de rendre des services à la suite d'une faillite.

L'OFT a suggéré :

1. Une garantie assurée.
2. Des cautions similaires à celles des agents de voyage.
3. Des comptes en fiducie : les acomptes seraient versés dans ces comptes et garantis par une assurance.
4. Une caisse centrale créée à partir des cotisations des membres.
5. Un « compte client » similaire à un compte en fiducie sans être administré par un tiers.

Puisqu'elle jugeait ces options peu viables, la BAR a levé plusieurs objections d'ordre pratique :

1. Ce ne sont pas tous nos membres qui exigent un acompte. Ceux qui en demandent se font payer par carte de crédit, ce qui protège déjà les consommateurs.
2. Il s'écoule généralement moins de deux semaines entre le paiement et le déménagement, ce qui réduit le risque.
3. En cas de faillite du membre, le syndic s'assurerait de l'exécution des travaux, soit grâce au personnel et au matériel de l'entreprise, soit

par un sous-traitant. Nous avons fait valoir que les déménageurs avaient déjà l'habitude de s'entraider.

Autre problème : le code est écrit pour s'appliquer seulement aux déménagements intrabritanniques, puisqu'il est difficile d'assurer autrement que les exigences relatives aux acomptes seront respectées. La Consumer's Association estimait que le code devait s'appliquer à tous les membres de la BAR et qu'on créerait, sinon, de la confusion chez les consommateurs.

Nous avons dû expliquer à l'OFT que les membres de la BAR n'adhérait pas tous à l'Overseas Group, dont les adhérents sont protégés par l'International Movers Mutual Insurance (IMMI). Ce qui ne les empêche pas d'accepter des déménagements à l'étranger. Ils peuvent exécuter le travail eux-mêmes ou le confier à un sous-traitant qui n'est pas nécessairement membre de l'Overseas Group ni même de la BAR.

often assist each other with labour when needed).

Another problem arises from the fact that the Code is written to apply only to UK domestic moves because of difficulties otherwise in meeting the pre-payment requirement. The Consumers' Association was of the opinion that the Code must cover all members of BAR, and that it would lead to significant consumer confusion if parts of the membership were excluded from the Code.

We had to explain to OFT that not all BAR members belong to the Overseas Group, whose customers are protected by the International Movers Mutual Insurance (IMMI) scheme, and yet they may still accept work destined for overseas. They may handle the work themselves or subcontract it to another company (which may or may not be an Overseas Group member, or even a member of BAR at all).

After much discussion and referral to the OFT Legal Department, it

became apparent that if BAR were to achieve OFT recognition for the Code, we must find a way to set up a workable scheme to fully protect customers' pre-payments.

I would remark here that some members have suggested that BAR simply make it a condition of membership that no members charge in advance. Perhaps it is not just the OFT that overestimates the ability of the Association to "deliver" its members!

Given that the IMMI scheme for overseas moves was already in place, it made sense to explore the possibility of extending a similar protection to UK moves, provided this could be achieved easily and with a minimum of administration.

IMMI has considerable experience insuring a similar and associated risk — more than other insurers — and we are currently exploring possibilities with it.

IMMI has already indicated that it is willing and able (subject to shareholders' approval) to take on this risk. To

this end, we need to obtain information about the risk and sums involved.

In the two weeks following the conference, a questionnaire will be circulated to all larger members and a representative sample of the general membership. It will ask for details of their accounts, a turnover declaration, and about proportion paid in advance, in which categories of work, and over what period of time.

Confidentiality of information is guaranteed by Willis Management (Guernsey); BAR will receive only aggregates and averages. Individual company information will not be passed on. ■

Notons au passage que certains membres ont suggéré que la BAR rende l'adhésion conditionnelle à ce que les membres n'exigent aucun acompte. On voit que l'OFT n'est pas seul à surestimer le pouvoir de contrainte de notre association.

Comme le cadre de protection de l'IMMI est déjà en place pour les déménagements à l'étranger, il était logique d'envisager une extension de cette protection aux déménagements intérieurs, ce qui demande moins d'administration.

L'IMMI possède une expérience supérieure dans l'assurance des risques de ce genre : nous explorons donc cette avenue.

L'IMMI, sous réserve de l'approbation de ses actionnaires, s'est déjà montrée ouverte à l'idée de couvrir ces éventualités. Nous devons cependant

mieux connaître les risques et les montants en cause.

Getting Past the Gauntlet

After 9/11, Tighter Rules Make the Job of Moving Goods In and Out of the U.S Tougher — But Not Impossible

For Pete Helgeson, the international moving business has become more complicated since the attacks of September 11 three years ago, but fortunately it hasn't become impossible.

As vice president-general manager of Atlas Van Lines International, Helgeson believes greater emphasis on customer education — along with getting all of the company's agents and personnel to use new forms and procedures — can make international moves go almost as smoothly as before 9/11.

"We've had to refine the process and it now takes more time and cost to do it, but it's not impossible," he said. "As long as the customers understand the new rules and what's involved on their part, and our personnel adhere to the new rules, we can eliminate major delays in their shipments."

Bob Mathews, vice president-international for Interstate Van Lines, agrees. He explained, "The key is to give our customers good guidelines as to what's acceptable and what's not."

That's especially true when it comes to the concepts of what have become termed "known" and "unknown" shippers.

"Any shipment of personal effects is most likely going to be categorized as being sent by an 'unknown' shipper, since people move only once or twice in a year. They don't send shipments at

least three or four times a month to qualify as a 'known' shipper," he said. "Even if that person is the director of the Central Intelligence Agency, their personal-effects shipment is going to get that 'unknown shipper' label, so they need to recognize that."

Another example of pre- and post-9/11 changes, said Atlas' Helgeson, revolves around "PBOs." Individuals preparing for international moves used to be allowed to pack their own boxes and simply list on their shipment manifest, "Packed By Owner," or PBO.

"That's definitely a no-no now," Helgeson said. "Under today's security rules, that's simply not acceptable. Today, customers can still pack their own boxes, but the mover must physically inspect and list the contents of those boxes before they are sealed and shipped."

That takes time and creates more cost, but as long as everyone understands that it has to be done — that there are no options — then it's a process than can go smoothly without delays, he said.

Judy Wohlt, spokesperson for global relocation firm SIRVA, added that customer awareness is critical, as not only has the number of inspections increased; so, too, has their severity.

"The customer has to be more aware and more involved in what's going on with their international shipment, because there is more paperwork to fill out and more work to do on our end, and that impacts both us and the customer," she said.

"It's a business shift for us — it requires more work and more time — but we can get the customer through the process as long as all of their ducks, i.e., forms, paperwork, etc., are lined up in a row."

It's also critical that customers are made aware of the potential for delays, especially if they don't follow the proper procedures, stressed Helgeson.

"There are more forms to fill out now, but most customers are in a hurry. They are anxious to move," he pointed out. "Yet if they miss a form, their shipment is going to be delayed, as U.S. Customs will inspect it. And remember that Customs won't repack their packages the same way. That's not their job and customers need to know that."

New Rules, New Enforcement

After the creation of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) in late 2002, borders became one of its top focal points — and a new, beefed-up version of U.S. Customs came into being.

DHS, with 22 agencies and 170,000 federal employees, is the largest federal government reorganization since the Department of Defense was created in 1947. The Transportation Security Agency, the U.S. Coast Guard, and the border-security arm of the U.S. Customs Service were transferred to the DHS from their respective homes in the Transportation and the Treasury Departments.

This put security for the nation's 301

Selon M. Pete Helgeson, les choses sont plus compliquées qu'avant le 11 septembre pour les entreprises de déménagement qui exercent des activités à l'échelle internationale mais, heureusement, les obstacles ne sont pas insurmontables.

M. Helgeson est vice-président et directeur général de Atlas Van Lines International. Il croit que les entreprises de déménagement peuvent effectuer des déménagements presque aussi facilement qu'avant le 11 septembre si elles informent bien leurs clients et s'assurent que tous leurs agents et tous leurs employés utilisent les nouveaux formulaires et suivent les nouvelles procédures.

« Nous avons dû revoir les processus qui exigent maintenant plus de temps et nécessitent des coûts supplémentaires mais la tâche n'est pas impossible à faire, dit-il. Si les clients sont bien informés des nouvelles règles et de ce qu'ils doivent faire pour simplifier les choses et si le personnel respecte les nouvelles exigences, nous pouvons éviter des retards importants dans les expéditions. »

M. Bob Mathews, vice-président à l'échelle internationale de Interstate Van Lines, abonde dans le même sens : « Le secret c'est de donner à nos clients les bonnes directives sur ce qui est

acceptable et ce qui ne l'est pas. »

C'est particulièrement vrai lorsqu'il est question des concepts expéditeur « connu » et expéditeur « inconnu ».

« Comme les gens ne déménagent en général pas plus qu'une ou deux fois

par année, l'envoi de leurs effets personnels sera fort probablement classé comme provenant d'un expéditeur "inconnu", poursuit-il. Ce sont généralement les personnes qui envoient des marchandises au moins trois ou quatre fois par mois qui sont considérées comme des expéditeurs "connus". Même si la personne qui déménage est le directeur de l'Agence centrale de renseignement (CIA), on apposera l'étiquette "expéditeur inconnu" sur ses boîtes d'effets personnels. Les clients doivent accepter cette règle. »

M. Helgeson cite l'exemple d'un autre changement survenu après le 11 septembre : le code « PBO » (« Packed by Owner ») ou « EPP » (Emballé par le propriétaire). Auparavant, les personnes qui préparaient leur déménagement à l'étranger étaient autorisées à remplir leurs boîtes elles-mêmes et à inscrire « Emballé par le propriétaire » ou « EPP » sur le manifeste d'expédition.

« C'est tout à fait contre-indiqué de procéder ainsi maintenant, dit M. Helgeson. En vertu des nouvelles règles de sécurité, c'est tout simplement inacceptable. Aujourd'hui, les clients peuvent encore remplir eux-mêmes leurs boîtes mais ils doivent en faire inspecter le contenu par le personnel de l'entreprise de déménagement qui dresse la liste de ce que chaque boîte contient avant de la sceller et de l'expédier. »

Watching the Blank Spots

Think that dirt road in southern Texas leading to Mexico isn't watched? Think again.

U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) and its border-patrol agents are tightening security between major ports of entry into the country — land and sea — via a more comprehensive border-enforcement strategy that uses a variety of technology and communication systems to make border “blank spots” more visible.

These initiatives include:

- Integrated Surveillance Intelligence System (ISIS), a system that uses remotely monitored night/day camera and sensing systems to better detect, monitor and respond to illegal crossings.
- Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs), equipped with sophisticated onboard sensors. UAVs provide long-range surveillance and are useful for monitoring remote land-border areas, where patrols cannot easily travel and infrastructure is difficult or impossible to build.
- Remote Video Surveillance Systems (RVSS), which provide coverage 24 hours a day, seven days a week to detect illegal crossings on both the northern and southern U.S. borders.
- Geographic Information System (GIS), a CBP Border Patrol southwest border initiative to track illegal migration patterns.

ports, including port access for trucks, and border crossing squarely in DHS's lap.

U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) is now the unified border agency within the DHS, and it combines the inspectional workforces and broad border authorities of U.S. Customs, U.S. Immigration, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, and the entire U.S. Border Patrol.

CBP now includes more than 41,000 employees, who are charged with the responsibility of managing, controlling and protecting the nation's borders, at and between the official ports of entry.

“We understand that as America's frontline, the security of a nation rests on our shoulders,” said CBP Commissioner Robert Bonner. “We have learned the lessons of 9/11 and are working day and night to make America safer and more secure. For the first time in our nation's history, one agency has the lone responsibility of protecting our borders.”

He stressed that, “Our priority mission, from here on out, is preventing terrorists and terrorist weapons from entering the U.S., while facilitating legitimate trade and travel.”

To do that, CBP is relying on a variety of technologies to “weed out” suspicious cargo and/or travelers from the mix — technologies that can either help speed along relocation shipments or stop them dead in their tracks.

On the cargo side, CBP uses advance information from its Automated Targeting System (ATS), Automated Export System (AES), and the Trade Act of 2002 Advance Electronic Information Regulations to identify cargo that may pose a threat. Then CBP's Office of Intelligence and the National Targeting Center (NTC) pull all of that information together to provide tactical “targeting” of suspicious shipments.

“Using risk-management techniques, they evaluate people and goods to identify a suspicious individual or container before it can reach our shores,” said Bonner. Blank forms or several “PBO” items on a shipping manifest are just two items that can get a shipment highlighted by these targeting systems.

The Automated Commercial Envi-

ronment (ACE) has made electronic risk management far more effective, Bonner added, with its “Secure Data Portal” providing a single, centralized on-line access point to connect CBP and the trade community. “CBP's modernization efforts enhance border security while optimizing the ever-increasing flow of legitimate trade,” he said.

Pushing Smart Borders Further

The CBP has focused on not only creating “smarter borders” through greater use of technology, but also extending the nation's “zone of security,” as Bonner puts it, well beyond the physical borders of the U.S.

Governing ocean cargo is the CBP's Container Security Initiative (CSI), which pushes the U.S. border “outward” by working jointly with CBP's counterparts in other nations to identify and pre-screen containers that might pose a risk at the foreign port of departure before they are loaded onboard vessels bound for the U.S.

CSI is now implemented in 20 ports that are the largest in terms of container shipments to the U.S., Bonner said.

CBP has also implemented joint initiatives with Canada and Mexico on a variety of levels to more closely watch transborder cargo via “land” gateways, such as Laredo, Texas. The U.S. and Canada have signed what's called the Smart Border Declaration and agreed to 30 specific action points to improve cargo security, while Mexico and the U.S. have signed the Smart Border Accord.

Several different systems and procedures are now in place on both borders to screen both people and cargo. The Secure Electronic Network for Travelers' Rapid Inspection (SENTRI) allows pre-screened, low-risk travelers from Mexico to be processed in an expeditious manner through dedicated lanes, said Bonner.

“Similarly, on our northern border with Canada, we are engaging in NEXUS to identify and facilitate low-risk travelers,” he added. “Along both borders, CBP has implemented the Free and Secure Trade (FAST) program,

M. Helgeson reconnaît que cette procédure prend du temps et entraîne des coûts supplémentaires mais il ajoute que, si tout le monde comprend qu'elle est incontournable et qu'il n'y a pas d'autre choix, elle peut se faire sans problèmes et sans retard.

Mme Judy Wohlt, porte-parole de l'entreprise de déménagement mondiale SIRVA, ajoute qu'il est essentiel de bien informer le client non seulement du fait que le nombre d'inspections a augmenté mais également que les mesures sont plus sévères.

« Les clients doivent être mieux informés de la marche à suivre pour envoyer des marchandises à l'étranger et faire preuve de collaboration. L'augmentation du nombre de documents à remplir et le travail supplémentaire qui en découle ont des répercussions tant sur nous et que sur les clients, » poursuit-elle.

« C'est un changement important dans nos activités, un processus qui demande plus de travail et plus de temps, mais les clients peuvent y prendre part en commençant pas fournir des documents et des formulaires en règle. »

Selon M. Helgeson, il est également très important que les clients soient mis au courant de la possibilité qu'il y ait des retards surtout s'ils ne suivent pas correctement la procédure.

« Il y a maintenant plus de formulaires à remplir et la plupart des clients sont pressés et ont hâte de déménager, ajoute-t-il. Il est important de leur rappeler que, s'il manque un formulaire, l'expédition sera retardée parce que le service des douanes américaines devra inspecter le contenu de leurs boîtes. Nous rappelons que le remballage des boîtes comme elles étaient ne fait pas partie des tâches des douaniers. »

Des nouvelles règles, des nouveaux moyens d'application

Après sa création à la fin de 2002, le *U.S. Department of Homeland Security* (DHS) (ministère de la sécurité intérieure des États-Unis) a concentré ses énergies sur une de ses principales priorités, la sécurité des frontières. Une nouvelle version plus musclée du service des douanes américaines a alors vu le jour.

À force d'appliquer

Le DHS compte 22 agences et 170 000 employés fédéraux. C'est le plus important remaniement auquel un gouvernement fédéral a procédé depuis la création du ministère de la Défense en 1947. La *Transportation Security Agency* (agence de sécurité dans les transports), la *U.S. Coast Guard* (garde côtière américaine) et la branche du *U.S. Customs Service* (service des douanes américaines) affectée à la sécurité des frontières qui relevaient respectivement du ministère des Transports et du Département du Trésor ont été transférés au DHS.

Depuis cette réorganisation, la sécurité des 301 ports du pays, y compris l'accès des camions aux ports, et le passage des personnes et des marchandises aux frontières sont sous l'entière responsabilité du DHS.

Le *U.S. Customs and Border Protection* (CBP) (le service des douanes et de la protection des frontières américaines) est maintenant l'agence unifiée responsable de la sécurité des frontières au sein

du DHS et regroupe tout le personnel affecté à l'inspection et aux douanes des *U.S. Customs* (douanes américaines), du *U.S. Immigration* (service d'immigration américains), du *Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service* (service d'inspection de la santé des plantes et des animaux) ainsi que tout le personnel de la *U.S. Border Patrol* (police des frontières américaines).

Le CBP compte plus de 41 000 employés qui sont responsables de la gestion, du contrôle et de la protection des frontières autant dans les ports d'entrée qu'entre les postes frontaliers.

« Comme nous sommes sur la ligne de front de l'Amérique, la sécurité de la nation repose sur nos épaules, dit le commissaire du CBP, M. Robert Bonner. Nous avons tiré des leçons du 11 septembre et nous travaillons jour et nuit à sécuriser l'Amérique. C'est la première fois dans l'histoire de notre pays que la protection des frontières relève d'une seule agence. »

Il ajoute : « Notre première mission est d'empêcher que des terroristes et des armes pouvant servir à perpétrer des attentats entrent aux États-Unis tout en facilitant le commerce et les voyages légitimes. »

Pour remplir sa mission, le CBP fait appel à une gamme d'outils technologiques dans le but de « retirer de la circulation » les marchandises ou les voyageurs suspects. Ces outils servent tout autant à accélérer le transport des effets personnels des gens qui déménagent d'un pays à l'autre qu'à intercepter rapidement les colis suspects.

Pour ce qui est du fret, CBP utilise l'information préalable fournie par ses systèmes *Automated Targeting System* (ATS) (système de ciblage automatisé) et *Automated Export System* (AES) (système d'exportation automatisé) ainsi que les dispositions des *Advance Electronic Information Regulations* de la loi dite *Trade Act of 2002* pour repérer le fret qui peut constituer une menace. Le *Office of Intelligence and the National Targeting Center* (NTC) du CBP (centre de ciblage national et le bureau de l'intelligence) réunit ensuite toute l'information recueillie pour procéder au « ciblage » tactique des envois suspects.

[which] uses transponder technology and pre-arrival shipment information to process participating trucks as they arrive at the border, expediting trade while better securing our borders.”

In addition, an agreement with Canada allows CBP to target, screen and examine rail shipments headed to the U.S., Bonner noted, and the agency has established so-called “attachés” in Mexico and Canada to coordinate border-security issues.

Also, CBP Border Patrol agents, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, and the Drug Enforcement Administration, as well as state and local law-enforcement agencies from Canada and the U.S. have joined together to form 14 Integrated Border Enforcement Teams (IBET) to beef up security over the wide open “blanks spaces” along the border.

“Covering our entire mutual border with Canada, these teams are used to target cross-border smuggling between Canada and the U.S.,” said Bonner. “The teams focus on criminal activity, such as smuggling of drugs, humans and contraband, and cross-border terrorist movements.”

Movers React to Change

While most of the CBP’s efforts focus on the flow of people and commercial freight through U.S. ports of entry, relocations don’t go unnoticed. That’s why movers with significant international business have stepped up their own efforts to provide security.

“We’ve been able to adapt to the new security environment,” said Jim Gaw, director of Bekins Van Lines’ International Division. “It requires mainly more paperwork from us, and more scrutiny on the part of [CBP] personnel, but as long as we have all the “i”s dotted and the “t”s crossed, it has not necessarily made it a longer shipping process.”

Helgeson said one of the first things Atlas did was to make sure all of its forwarders and agents handling international shipments were “on the same page” in regard to following the same procedures, making sure the customer filled out all the right forms, and in general sharpening their focus on security.

If a mover has the right security procedures and policies and properly educates the customer, delays — and costs — can be minimized.

In addition to the training efforts for its staff and related personnel, Atlas also instituted a “security seal” program last year for its high-value items: once packages are inspected and tallied by Atlas, they are sealed with special locks, so any shipment tampering can be quickly identified.

“Not only does it give the customer greater peace of mind, it shows Customs we’re serious about shipment security,” Helgeson said. “That gives Customs the incentive to trust us and our security procedures. So once they see our agents and forwarders on a regular basis and that our security policies are being followed, we become a ‘known’ shipper to them.”

He added, “There are still pockets of frustration, but by and large, these efforts have made international movements much easier for us.”

Bekins’ Gaw added that the new requirements have also necessitated a range of planning changes to compensate for the tighter timeframes required for the arrival of paperwork/bill of lading.

“In many cases, paperwork needs to arrive a week ahead of a shipment, whereas before 9/11 it could get there the same day the shipment arrived,” he said. “However, that just requires us to change how we plan out a shipment, not necessarily making it longer. It’s just an additional step we — and the customer — need to take.”

Using the same procedures over and over also helps make heightened security practices a “routine” occurrence in the minds of Atlas’ personnel, Helgeson observed, and that makes the movement of goods under these conditions gradually faster and smoother.

“Once you go through the process two or three times, everyone understands what to do — it becomes ‘cookie cutter’ in nature,” he said.

“It also helps that, in a lot of ways, moving goods into and out of the U.S. is now slightly easier than right after 9/11, because the security personnel on the government side have had time to see who is taking security seriously and focus on those shipments and areas where the risk is highest.”

Tomorrow’s Technology Today

The CBP has long recognized the need to involve the private sector in its security efforts, which is why several current and future initiatives are aimed at making that participation easier and smoother.

The Customs-Trade Partnership Against Terrorism (C-TPAT) is but one example: a joint government/business initiative designed to strengthen overall supply chain and border security, while facilitating legitimate, compliant trade, said CBP’s Bonner.

“Processing the sheer volume of trade entering the U.S. each year requires help from the private sector, he said. “To date, over 6,500 companies are partnering with CBP via C-TPAT, and it is the largest, most successful government/private-sector partnership to arise out of 9/11.”

In addition, CBP is now testing a new system called the Advanced Trade Data Initiative (ATDI), which will work the trade community to obtain information on U.S.-bound goods at the earliest-possible point in the supply chain.

“Partnering with carriers, importers, shippers and terminal operators, we will gather supply chain data and feed it into our systems to validate container shipments during the supply process,” said Bonner. “This information increases CBP’s existing ability to zero in on

« Les personnes et les marchandises sont évaluées à l'aide de techniques de gestion du risque et celles d'entre elles qui sont suspectes sont repérées avant même d'atteindre les côtes de l'Amérique, » dit M. Bonner. Par exemple, si des formulaires requis ne sont pas remplis au complet ou si plusieurs articles portent la mention "EPP" sur un manifeste d'expédition, les systèmes de ciblage les détecteront.

« Grâce au *Automated Commercial Environment* (ACE) (l'environnement commercial automatisé), la gestion électronique du risque est beaucoup plus efficace, ajoute M. Bonner. Le *Secure Data Portal* (portail de données sécuritaires) de l'ACE offre un seul point d'accès en ligne centralisé pour se brancher au CBP et à la communauté d'affaires. Les efforts de modernisation du CBP améliorent la sécurité aux frontières tout en facilitant le plus possible les échanges commerciaux légitimes dont le volume augmente sans cesse, » précise-t-il.

Repousser les frontières intelligentes plus loin

En plus de travailler à la création de « frontières intelligentes » grâce à une utilisation accrue de la technologie, le CBP veut élargir la « zone de sécurité » du pays, comme l'appelle M. Bonner, bien au-delà des frontières physiques des États-Unis.

Pour le transport maritime, le CBP utilise le *Container Security Initiative* (CSI) (système de sécurité des conteneurs) qui lui permet de « repousser » les frontières américaines vers l'extérieur. Le CBP travaille en collaboration avec des organismes équivalents dans d'autres pays pour repérer et examiner à l'avance les conteneurs qui pourraient représenter un risque. Le repérage et l'examen des conteneurs suspects se font dans le port étranger avant le chargement des conteneurs à bord des navires en partance pour les États-Unis.

M. Bonner précise que le CSI est maintenant en place dans les 20 plus importants ports du monde au titre du nombre d'expéditions par conteneurs envoyées aux États-Unis.

Le CBP a également pris des initia-

tives conjointes avec le Canada et le Mexique à divers paliers pour surveiller plus étroitement le passage des marchandises aux points d'entrée « terrestres » comme celui de Laredo (Texas). Les États-Unis et le Canada ont signé une Déclaration sur la frontière intelligente et se sont entendus sur un plan d'action en 30 points spécifiques pour améliorer la sécurité aux frontières. Le Mexique et les États-Unis ont signé l'Accord sur la frontière intelligente.

Selon M. Bonner, plusieurs systèmes et procédures sont maintenant en place des deux côtés de la frontière pour contrôler les personnes et les marchandises. Le *Secure Electronic Network for Travelers' Rapid Inspection* (SENTRI) (réseau électronique sécurisé pour l'inspection rapide des voyageurs) permet de présélectionner les voyageurs en provenance du Mexique qui représentent un faible risque et de les faire passer la frontière plus rapidement en leur faisant emprunter des voies réservées.

« De même, à la frontière nord que nous partageons avec le Canada, nous avons mis en place le programme NEXUS pour identifier les voyageurs à faible risque et faciliter leur passage à la frontière, ajoute-t-il. Le long de la frontière avec le Canada et de celle avec le Mexique, le CBP utilise le Programme d'expéditions rapides et sécuritaires (EXPRES) Free and Secure Trade (FAST). Faisant appel à la technologie des transpondeurs et à l'information préalable, ce programme permet la prise en charge des camions participants dès leur arrivée à la frontière et d'accélérer le commerce tout en assurant la sécurité des frontières. »

De plus, en vertu d'une convention intervenue avec le Canada, le CBP peut cibler, contrôler et examiner les marchandises expédiées par train à destination des États-Unis, fait remarquer M. Bonner, et l'agence a affecté des « attachés » au Mexique et au Canada pour coordonner les questions relatives à la sécurité nationale.

Des agents du *CBP Border Patrol* (police de la frontière), de la Gendarmerie royale du Canada et de la *Drug Enforcement Administration* de

La surveillance des points d'entrée entre les postes frontaliers

Vous pensez que cette petite route du sud du Texas menant au Mexique n'est pas surveillée ? Détrompez-vous.

Le *U.S. Customs and Border Protection* (CBP) et ses agents de surveillance des frontières resserrent les contrôles entre les grands points d'entrée par route et par mer vers le territoire américain. Le CBP a mis au point une stratégie de surveillance des frontières plus rigoureuse qui fait appel à une variété de technologies et de systèmes de communication pour avoir l'œil sur les zones peu fréquentées qui séparent les postes frontaliers.

Ces initiatives comprennent :

- *Integrated Surveillance Intelligence System* (ISIS) (système de surveillance intelligente intégrée), un système de caméras et d'appareils de détection surveillé jour et nuit pour mieux détecter et surveiller les passages illégaux à la frontière.
- *Unmanned Aerial Vehicles* (UAV) (aéronefs sans pilote), des aéronefs munis de capteurs ultra perfectionnés. Les UAV parcourent de longues distances pour surveiller les régions frontalières éloignées difficiles d'accès par la police des frontières ou les zones où il est impossible de construire des infrastructures.
- *Remote Video Surveillance Systems* (RVSS) (systèmes de surveillance par vidéo à distance), des systèmes qui surveillent jour et nuit les frontières pour détecter les passages illégaux à la frontière nord et à la frontière sud.
- *Geographic Information System* (GIS) (système d'information géographique), une initiative que la police du CBP qui surveille la frontière sud-ouest a prise pour repérer les immigrants illégaux.

suspect movements and perform any necessary security inspections at the earliest-possible point in the supply chain.”

He added that the use of detection technology is “essential” to this program, and points to the deployment of Non-Intrusive Inspection (NII) technology as an example. “It’s increasing and viewed as a ‘force multiplier’ that enables CBP officers to screen or examine a larger portion of the stream of commercial traffic,” Bonner noted.

“CBP does not rely on any single technology or inspection process. Instead, officers and agents use various technologies in different combinations to substantially increase the likelihood that terrorist weapons, including a nuclear or radiological weapon, will be detected and interdicted.”

Other technologies deployed at land and sea ports of entry, as well as airports, include large-scale X-ray and Gamma-imaging systems.

“CBP has also deployed radiation-detection technology, including Personal Radiation Detectors (PRDs), radiation isotope identifiers, and radiation portal monitors — even trained explosive- and chemical-detector dogs,” Bonner said. “Then there’s CBP’s Laboratories and Scientific Services Fast Response Team, which operates 24/7 year round and is charged with reacting to calls on suspicious containers.”

All of those technological and procedural security efforts make international relocations into and out of the U.S. more challenging today for certain, but Helgeson said if the mover has the right security procedures and policies in place and properly educates the customer as to what’s expected of them, delays — and costs — can be minimized.

“Sure, it takes more time and adds more cost to the move, but if done right, delays won’t be significant,” he said. “That’s the key today.” ■

même que ceux des services responsables de l’application des lois au Canada et aux États-Unis ont uni leurs efforts et ont formé 14 Équipes intégrées de la police des frontières (EIPF) du Canada et des États-Unis pour renforcer la sécurité dans les zones peu fréquentées qui séparent les postes frontaliers le long de la frontière.

« Ces équipes patrouillent toute la frontière commune entre le Canada et les États-Unis pour empêcher la contrebande entre les deux pays, ajoute M. Bonner. Leur mission est axée sur les activités criminelles, comme la contrebande de drogues ainsi que le passage d’immigrants illégaux et de terroristes à la frontière. »

Les entreprises de déménagement réagissent au changement

Le gros du travail du CBP est concentré sur la circulation des personnes et du fret commercial qui entrent et sortent des ports d’entrée américains, mais les déménagements sont aussi dans la mire du CBP. C’est pourquoi les entreprises de déménagement qui exercent d’importantes activités à l’échelle internationale ont redoublé d’efforts pour assurer la sécurité aux frontières.

« Nous nous sommes adaptés aux nouvelles réalités qui entourent la sécurité des frontières, affirme M. Jim Gaw, directeur de la division internationale de Bekins Van Line. Nous avons plus de documents à remplir et nous savons que le personnel du CBP est beaucoup plus vigilant qu’avant mais si nous respectons toutes les formalités, le processus d’expédition n’est pas nécessairement plus long. »

M. Helgeson ajoute qu’une des premières mesures que Atlas a prises a été de voir à ce que tous les transitaires et les commissaires qu’elle affecte aux expéditions internationales soient « sur la même longueur d’onde » lorsqu’il s’agit de respecter les procédures, de s’assurer que le client a rempli tous les formulaires nécessaires et de miser sur la sécurité.

En plus de former adéquatement son personnel et le personnel connexe, Atlas a mis sur pied un programme de « scellé

de sécurité » l’année dernière pour l’emballage des articles de grande valeur : une fois que les boîtes ont été inspectées et pointées par Atlas, elles sont scellées avec une étiquette inviolable de sorte qu’elles ne puissent être ouvertes sans être repérées rapidement.

« Les mesures mises en place assurent au client une tranquillité d’esprit et prouvent aux autorités douanières que nous prenons très au sérieux la sécurité des expéditions, » dit M. Helgeson. Les autorités douanières développent une confiance en notre entreprise et en nos procédures de sécurité. Quand nos commissaires et nos transitaires rencontrent régulièrement les autorités douanières et que ces dernières constatent que nos politiques de sécurité sont suivies, nous devenons un expéditeur “connu” des autorités douanières. »

M. Helgeson précise que : « Il subsiste des foyers de frustration mais, en général, ces mesures ont grandement facilité les déménagements internationaux. »

M. Gaw ajoute que les nouvelles exigences ont également nécessité la mise en place d’un éventail de changements en matière de planification pour être en mesure de respecter les délais plus serrés exigés dans la production des formulaires et des connaissements.

« Dans de nombreux cas, les documents doivent arriver une semaine avant que le chargement se présente à la frontière, tandis qu’avant le 11 septembre ils pouvaient arriver le même jour, dit-il. Nous n’avons eu besoin que de changer notre façon de planifier l’expédition sans nécessairement rallonger le processus. Cela ne représente qu’une étape de plus à franchir pour nous et pour le client. »

À force d’appliquer les nouvelles procédures, le personnel d’Atlas en vient graduellement à considérer le resserrement des mesures de sécurité comme une tâche de « routine », observe M. Helgeson. Par conséquent, la circulation des marchandises se fait peu à peu plus rapidement et plus efficacement.

« Une fois qu’il a exécuté le processus deux ou trois fois, tout le monde comprend bien ce qu’il doit faire et le travail se fait automatiquement, » poursuit-il.

« Sous beaucoup d’aspects, la mise en

place des nouvelles procédures fait en sorte que les marchandises en provenance ou à destination des États-Unis passent la frontière un peu plus facilement qu'aux lendemains du 11 septembre parce que les autorités responsables de la sécurité ont appris à connaître les entreprises qui prennent la sécurité au sérieux et peuvent se concentrer sur les expéditions et les secteurs à risque plus élevé. »

La technologie de demain aujourd'hui

Le CBP est bien conscient qu'il doit travailler en partenariat avec le secteur privé pour assurer la sécurité du pays. C'est pourquoi plusieurs mesures actuelles et futures visent à faciliter ce partenariat.

De l'avis de M. Bonner, le Programme de partenariat contre le terrorisme (C-TPAT) n'est qu'un exemple des mesures mises en place : une initiative des gouvernements et des entreprises conçue pour renforcer la sécurité de la chaîne d'approvisionnement et des frontières tout en facilitant le passage du commerce légitime.

« Pour traiter l'important volume de marchandises qui entrent aux États-Unis chaque année, nous avons besoin de l'aide du secteur privé, dit-il. Jusqu'à maintenant, plus de 6 500 sociétés sont partenaires de CBP dans le programme C-TPAT. C'est le plus important et plus efficace partenariat public-privé mis en place depuis le 11 septembre. »

De plus, le CBP met actuellement à l'essai un nouveau système appelé *Advanced Trade Data Initiative* (ATDI) (programme de données commerciales préalables) qui, avec la collaboration des gens d'affaires, permettra d'obtenir de l'information sur les marchandises expédiées aux États-Unis le plus tôt possible dans la chaîne d'approvisionnement.

« En nous associant avec des transporteurs, des importateurs, des chargeurs et des exploitants de terminaux, nous réunirons les données sur la chaîne d'approvisionnement et les entrerons dans nos systèmes pour valider les envois par conteneurs pendant le processus d'approvisionnement, affirme M. Bonner. Grâce à cette information, le CBP augmentera sa capacité de mettre rapidement le doigt sur

les expéditions suspectes et de procéder aux inspections jugées nécessaires le plus tôt possible dans la chaîne d'approvisionnement. »

Il ajoute que l'utilisation de la technologie de détection est « essentielle » dans le cadre de ce programme et donne comme exemple la technologie dite *Non-Intrusive Inspection* (NII) (Inspection non intrusive). « Cette technique est considérée comme un "multiplicateur de forces" qui permet aux agents du CBP d'examiner une plus grande portion du flux des marchandises commer-

ciales, » note M. Bonner.

« Le CBP ne compte pas sur une seule technologie ni sur un seul processus d'inspection pour remplir sa mission. Ses agents utilisent différentes combinaisons de technologies pour augmenter considérablement les chances de détecter et d'intercepter des armes nucléaires ou radioactives. »

Parmi les autres technologies utilisées dans les points d'entrée terrestres ou maritimes de même que dans les aéroports, notons les puissants systèmes d'inspection aux rayons X et d'imagerie à rayons Gamma.

« Le CBP utilise également la technologie de détection des radiations, notamment les *Personal Radiation Detectors* (PRD) (détecteurs de radiations personnels), des indicateurs d'isotopes de radiation et des moniteurs de radiation de même que des chiens dressés pour détecter des explosifs et des produits chimiques, note M. Bonner. Le CBP fait également appel à son *Laboratories and Scientific Services Fast Response Team* (équipe des services scientifiques et des laboratoires à réponse rapide) qui fonctionne jour et nuit et qui répond aux appels concernant les conteneurs suspects. »

Toutes les mesures technologiques et les procédures administratives visant à assurer la sécurité des frontières ont, dans certains cas, alourdi la tâche lorsqu'il s'agit de déménager aux États-Unis ou de quitter ce pays pour aller vivre à l'étranger, mais, selon M. Helgeson, si l'entreprise de déménagement met en place des méthodes et des politiques appropriées en matière de sécurité et si elle informe adéquatement ses clients sur ce qu'ils doivent faire, les délais et les coûts peuvent être réduits au minimum.

« Bien sûr, les procédures sont plus longues et entraînent des coûts supplémentaires mais si elles sont suivies convenablement, il n'y aura pas de délais importants, conclut-il. C'est la clé du succès de nos jours. » ■
